MAJOR BEHAVIOUR	BRICK	DEFINITION
Inappropriate Location	<mark>B</mark> R <mark>I</mark> C K	Student leaves the school ground.
Abusive or Inappropriate Language	<mark>B</mark> R I C <mark>K</mark>	Student delivers messages that include swearing, name calling, use of words in an inappro deliberately hurting someone with words.
Excluding Others	BRICK	The delivery of disrespectful messages in any format related to gender, ethnicity, sex, race features.
Physical Aggression	BRICK	<b>Student intentionally engages in actions involving serious physical or emotional harm</b> For example: hitting, punching, hitting with an object, kicking, hair pulling, scratching, tackling, pushing, sp
Property Damage/ Vandalism	<mark>B</mark> R I C K	Student deliberately destroys or defaces school or personal property.
Misuse of Technology	<mark>B</mark> R <mark>I</mark> C K	Student engages in serious inappropriate (as defined by school) use of mobile phone, mus computer, IPAD as outlined in 'Acceptable Use Agreement'
Theft	BRICK	Student is in possession of having, or passed on, or being responsible for removing some
Inappropriate Display of Affection	BRICK	Student engages in inappropriate comments, gestures or physical contact, either consens
